Message from the Dean of Students



Driven by the objective to nurture holistic professionals for the advancement of Hong Kong and beyond, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) places equal emphasis on delivering an excellent curriculum and providing comprehensive career services which aim at enabling students to acquire necessary competencies for their future contributions to the world. About Work-Integrated Education (WIE)

"To learn and to apply, for the benefit of mankind"—The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) upholds this motto by cultivating future leaders and nurturing global citizens who make contributions to the communities around the world. Since 2005, PolyU has incorporated Work-Integrated Education (WIE) into its curriculum, requiring all undergraduate students to complete the WIE component, which offers them with the opportunity to gain workplace experiences and develop global perspectives through practical training and cultural exchange.

Through participating in WIE internship programme, students are enabled to immerse in a work-based learning environment that is relevant to their chosen profession. The Careers and Placement Section of the Student Affairs Office (CPS, SAO) assists students in fulfilling the WIE requirement by supporting academic units to coordinate various internship opportunities in a wide array of industry sectors in Hong Kong, Mainland China, and overseas. To facilitate students' development of an international outlook while acquiring professional skills, students are encouraged to take on placement outside Hong Kong with the assistance from the Offshore WIE Sponsorship (OWS) that covers part of the costs incurred during their WIE trip.







Yearly average of WIE participants outside Hong Kong:








Globaleur focuses on helping large travel companies enhance
