




Quick Facts about Non-local WIE 2023

BEng (Hons) in Structural and Fire Safety Engineering

QED Structures | Barcelona, Spain



During the summer, I had the opportunity to intern at a structural engineering firm in Barcelona, which is renowned for its innovative architecture and expertise in complex structures. My responsibilities included structural calculations, utilising specialised software for structural modelling, and creating AutoCAD drawings.

One significant takeaway from this internship was the value of proactive communication. Working in a multilingual environment, I encountered language barriers that necessitated seeking clarification from colleagues.

Additionally, my supervisor fostered critical thinking and independence, encouraging me to solve problems autonomously before seeking assistance.

The Spanish work culture was characterised by flexibility, with no rigid format for completing assigned tasks and individuals working independently. The pace of work was slower and more relaxed compared to Hong Kong's, which presented a challenge in

adaptation. However, I embraced this opportunity to share my experiences with those unfamiliar with Hong Kong.

This internship provided valuable insights into Barcelona's architectural prowess, honed my communication skills, and allowed me to contribute my unique perspective in a diverse work environment

I am grateful for the opportunity to gain overseas experience and expand my skills and knowledge in the construction industry. During my internship at Archimax, I applied my technical skills acquired at PolyU while also learning new testing methods for building elements.

I thoroughly enjoyed the flexible and friendly work culture in New Zealand, where hierarchy was less pronounced compared to my previous experiences in Hong Kong. The work environment was casual, yet everyone was self-motivated. Teambuilding activities were held to recognise employee contributions, and



overtime work was discouraged to respect employees' personal time. Despite language barriers, I learnt to effectively communicate with colleagues from diverse backgrounds and cultures, fostering positive relationships based on mutual respect.

Living abroad presented daily challenges, such as navigating public transportation. However, these challenges strengthened my problem-solving skills and independence. Overall, New Zealand left a lasting impression on me. This unique internship experience was valuable and memorable. I highly recommend students to participate in International WIE for similar opportunities.

PT Jakarta International Container Terminal | Jakarta, Indonesia


My first internship exceeded my expectations in terms of hands-on learning, as I was able to gain valuable experience that was not attainable through university courses alone.

witnessed a vessel exceeding the speed limit in Victoria Harbour and observed the Marine Police stopping the ship and imposing a fine.

At the Training Centre, I familiarised myself with ship simulators used for maritime industry training. The centre provides on-the-job training for MD staff, enabling them to stay updated on the latest maritime knowledge. In VTC, I summarised Marine Incident Reports and converted them to electronic versions. I gained insights into vessel traffic control practices, including route regulation and recommendations for abnormal vessel routes.



I also appreciated the opportunities provided by MD to visit shipping companies and the Green Island Lighthouses, which are usually off-limits to the public. This internship expanded my horizons and deepened my understanding of MD's role as a regulator in Hong Kong's maritime sector.




Brandon Mathieu YUE
