

The programme inspires them to become all-round global youth leaders with an innovative mindset and a strong sense of ethics and morality, who aspire to contribute to social cohesion and the betterment of the world.

## EAGLE

AGLE the Adventurers" is a year-long advanced leadership programme designed to cultivate globally competent youth leaders with innovative thinking, a strong ethical sense and moral integrity. Through direct engagement, the programme empowers students to promote social cohesion and contribute to global betterment.

To equip students with necessary knowledge and skills to become all-round leaders, the programme offered a variety of training. The 27 students in the 2024/25 cohort learnt about the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, ethics in leadership, and intercultural competence. They also explored social innovation, design thinking, and participatory design in order to understand local needs and

co-create solutions with a community in Nepal. This culminated in a summer expedition where students implemented their self-designed social innovation projects alongside local community members.

Upon receiving extensive leadership training, these dedicated students successfully launched original projects addressing challenges in Nepal. By sourcing local resources, they co-created feasible and sustainable solutions to tackle community problems within a school setting. This inspiring experience fostered students' personal growth, sharpening their ethical awareness, leadership capabilities and global perspective, and igniting a lasting commitment to advancing sustainability both locally and globally.

# The EAGLE Journey in Kathmandu, Nepal

uring the enriching journey, EAGLE the Adventurers had the unique opportunity to engage with several impactful organisations in Kathmandu, Nepal. These pivotal visits to — World Vision International Nepal's BRiCKK Project; the United Nations House Nepal and the Chinese Embassy in Nepal — significantly broadened the students' perspectives. They were inspired to think critically about global citizenship and their roles as future youth leaders.



World Vision International Nepal (WVIN) and the BRICKK Project

WVIN introduced the BRiCKK Project (Building Resilience with Children in Kathmandu's Brick Kilns), a truly transformative initiative dedicated to protecting families and children from hazardous labour.








### **United Nations (UN) House Nepal**

The visit to the UN House provided profound insights into the nation's development. Mr. Dharma Swarnakar, Economic Advisor at the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), outlined Nepal's socio-economic challenges and emphasised the immense power of localizing UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Furthermore, students connected with five UN Volunteers, introduced by Mr. Suran Maharjan, Country Coordinator of UNV, sparkling discussions on potential opportunities to drive global change.







## The Chinese Embassy in Nepal

The delegation was warmly hosted at the Chinese Embassy in Nepal. Mr CHEN Song, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the PRC to Nepal, shared valuable insights on China-Nepal relations and key local livelihood projects. He inspired students to embrace a global mindset, apply critical thinking, and assume responsibility for shared prosperity. The students also had the opportunity to present their social innovation projects, earning considerable praise for their dedication and efforts.

## A Cleaner Fry: Enhancing Food Safety

"Edna" recognised a significant health concern in the school canteen: the repeated use of frying oil. They observed that without removing food particles and contaminants properly, the oil was breaking down rapidly, accumulating harmful substances and compromising the safety and quality of the food, and hence posing a risk to students' well-being.

To address this issue, the team, with advice from the Department of Applied Biology and Chemical Technology of PolyU, designed and implemented a simple yet highly effective oil filtration system for the school canteen. This system utilises activated carbon and diatomaceous earth to remove toxins, food particles, and free fatty acids from the used oil. By extending the oil's lifespan, this process not only ensures that fried food is safer and tastes better, but also aligns with several key Sustainable Development Goals.










Chemical Filtration Model - For the School Canteen



This journey fundamentally changed my understanding of leadership – it is not a solo act, it is about co-creating solutions with others. ## Alpha







Alpha ( $\alpha$ ) is the first letter of the Greek alphabet, symbolizing a beginning and a strong foundation. The team believes in striving for excellence in everything we do.

## A Clean Start: Automated Soap Dispenser

"Alpha" addressed a hygiene challenge at Tarun School, where over 1,800 students struggled with inconsistent handwashing every day. The school's liquid soap dispenser often ran out, while bar soap was unhygienic, thus increasing health risks for the entire student body.

To solve this problem, the group designed and built an automated, low-cost liquid soap dispenser powered by a Microbit. This system dispenses a pre-measured amount of liquid soap with a single push of a button. A five-second lockout feature that prevents misuse and waste, ensuring a consistent supply of soap for all students. This simple, yet effective solution not only promotes better hygiene but also encourages responsible resource consumption.



GOAT – the acronym for "Greatest of All Time", is dedicated to implementing a project that achieves a lasting and profound social impact, inspiring innovation for positive change.









## Powering Clean Air: A Sustainable Solution for School Hygiene

The student bathrooms at the Tarun school are small and heavily utilised. The poor ventilation, unpleasant odours, high humidity and slippery floors not only created an uncomfortable environment but also posed safety risks.

To tackle this, the GOAT team designed and installed an innovative solar-powered ventilation system utilising repurposed computer fans, effectively addresses moisture accumulation and stagnant air. The system features three core components: solar panels to harness renewable energy, strategically placed energy-efficient fans to maximize airflow, and a battery backup system for continuous operation during cloudy days or power outages.

The humidity in the washrooms dropped from an original baseline of 71% to an average of 57%, scientifically validating the ventilation system's operational efficacy in creating a healthier, safer space for students.

## **DIY Hand Sanitiser Machine**

Recognising that students at the Tarun school were hesitant to use communal soap dispensers due to hygiene concerns, Echo collaborated with them to co-create a sustainable, touch-free hand sanitiser machine that was not only safe but also easy to maintain.

The project centred on designing a simple and affordable dispenser using infrared sensor technology and readily available, recycled materials such as plastic bottles. Powered by rechargeable batteries, the machine provides a touch-free way to dispense alcohol-based sanitiser, reducing the spread of bacteria and viruses. Its simple design ensures that students and staff can take ownership of the project and manage the system on their own.













EAGLE taught me significant lesson about leadership. It reinforced the fundamental importance of leading with empathy, respecting individual boundaries, and treating every team member with dignity. We have to understand and respect each team member's capabilities, leveraging them to build a cohesive and productive team.

This journey also taught me the critical lesson of avoiding preconceived judgments. I learn to challenge stereotypes about people or places, choosing instead to approach new situations with an open-mind and learn from real experiences. In the

## **Evaluation Framework** and Deodorising **Charcoal Bag Initiative**

"Legend" developed a comprehensive evaluation framework to assess various EAGLE projects implemented at Tarun School. The team created two separate tools: one for on-site evaluation and another for longterm assessment. These frameworks included criteria such as user satisfaction, innovation, operational excellence, and alignment with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Different stakeholders were engaged to provide feedback using structured forms and reflection questions to systematically review project outcomes, identify improvements, and pinpoint areas for future development. Scores were weighted based on stakeholder roles and the group's priorities in order to gain a comprehensive view of each project's performance.
