On 30 January 2022, the Red hall of the Homantin Student Halls held an event themed: Better Public Space and Better Community! To get a deeper insight into this event, I got a chance to interview Bing - one of the event organisers.



According to Bing, a PhD student from the school of design, after living in the Homantin Student Hall for a while, she noticed that many residents use the public areas of the student halls. Hence, the arrangement and design of the hall public space are crucial for residency experience. With the wish of improving the hall environment, Bing conceived a design idea that allowed residents to participate in the public area design process. This was to accommodate more grounded ideas and make residents feel responsible for the public areas.

With the help of the hall tutors of Red Hall, Bing led the organisation of an event that saw participants collaborating to redesign and decorate the Red hall's public area. The zoning of the functional area in the public space became clearer and the furniture were well-placed than before. Event participants enjoyed working together and learnt the space arrangement technique from each other. This event further motivated active resident participation and suggestions on improving the student hall's public environment.

Moreover, the event has instilled the habit of weekly maintenance of the public area. Again, this has gradually influenced the behaviour of other residents to be aware of the public environment. Since then, hall residents would consciously return furniture to its place after using the public area as a way of working together to for a better Red Hall community.

All in all, the success of this event has inspired us to pay more attention to the public area of our community because a good hall environment not only offers residents a comfortable place to study and live but also give them a sense of belonging.

A more than Emcee training hall event!

The current pandemic and the fact that our beloved city, Hong Kong, is going through one of its most trying times have not dimmed the enthusiasm of residents in Hung Hom and Homatin student halls of residence. Along with a slew of other activities in the residences that keeps us entertained and going, the Education Team hosted a fun and educational online event on 16 February 2022 that brought together over 150 students to learn about public speaking, effective communication techniques, and how to effectively lead events.

One might simply think that "emceeing" is not a necessary skill set for everyone and is only valuable for a select few outgoing individuals. On the contrary, public speaking skill is of a significant advantage for everyone of us, as we are all involved in some capacity that requires effective communication. Mr. Ivan Chung, a senior manager responsible for co-curricular learning activities in the residences hosted and emceed the event. Using the words of Vince Lombardi, the host began by saying, "Practice does not make perfect. Only perfect practice makes perfect." Furthermore, he asserted that public speaking ability is not something that can be learned overnight, but continuous sharpening of your abilities and a consistent effort will result in you becoming a better public speaker over time. We got to know that by publicly facilitating or emceeing an event, one can be excellent at managing the entire or parts of the processes that make an event successful.

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This is evident in one's abilities to bring others together, educate them for better execution, manage the entire unit coherently while closely observing and utilizing various differences in the team to its advantage and holding the entire team together.



Ivan shared videos about popular emcees like Terry Crews from America's Got Talent show, Steve Harvey from The Original Kings of Comedy show and Anthony Mackie's 2021 ESPY's Monologue, to highlight qualities such as body language, eye contact, presence of mind, ability to connect with the crowd and keeping them engaged and glued. He then concluded the event by sharing three principles of effective verbal communication:

- "the receiver" of communication determines how good the communication is.
- good communication is based on the "sender's" awareness about the expectations of the audience (individual/group).
- good communication is based on what the audience needs to or wants to learn.

Alongside other residents, it was an incredible evening to be able to learn something to cultivate within. In an interview with one of the participants, Tobias So from the SHTM Department, stated that he chose to join the Emcee event to enhance the understanding and command in public speaking. He indicated the Emcee workshop pretty much met his expectations.ether.

Boyan Hall 2021 Online Welcoming Event



restrictions altering and hampering social and physical fitness activities, the Lisheng Hall on the 28th of March, 2022 held a virtual "Five-fowl play" event, a Chinese aerobics, to provide members with an opportunity to exercise their body while learning about the ancient Chinese culture. The event attracted a good number of participants within and outside of the hall.

The event started with a background about the "Five-fowl play". Through the background, participants learnt that the exercise originated in Haozhou, in China and it is among the most popular health and fitness exercises in China. Popular Chinese physician, Hua Tuo华陀, a big believer and promoter of preventive medicine with physical exercise is credited as the creator. The "Five-fowl play" is played by imitating the actions of five main animals - tiger, bear, deer, ape, and bird. Each of these animals represent different elements of exercising with enormous benefits on one's physical and mental wellbeing. For instance, the tiger movements are structured to represent the aggressive nature and fighting stance of a tiger, and engaging in these exercises has potential benefits for the liver and gallbladder. Similarly, ape movements reflect an ape's agility through movements such as climbing and jumping which is very good for the heart and blood circulation.





After the brief overview, participants were taken through some demonstrations on how to achieve the most benefits from these exercises. We were made aware that, while the exercise itself matters, the body posture during the exercise is equally important. After the demonstration, it was time for participants to practice what was taught and learned. But before the practice, there was a brief and entertaining "Kahoot time" with prizes for the top performers. Although I could not win any prize, I must say the experience was euphoric. When we finally had the chance to practice some of the moves, we felt very relaxed and rejuvenated.



Participants remarked that it was a wonderful experience and expressed a great interest in participating in an in-person version when the COVID-19 restrictions are eased.

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WE WILL OVERCOME AND SURVIVE



The recurring surge in the COVID-19 cases in Hong Kong has shifted the activities of the residents to intensify their protective measures to always stay safe. This has influenced university authorities to respond rapidly to help curb the spread on campus. In the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU), teaching is conducted online via MS Teams, Zoom or the Blackboard Collaborate. Additionally, a COVID-19 Rapid Response Taskforce (CRRTF) has been established to respond with rapid strategies to help curb the spread by providing relevant updates from the Department of Health to all staff and students, ensuring regular deep disinfection and cleaning of affected areas, and most importantly, providing and distributing Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits through the various departments. These actions according to Pablo Picasso are "foundational key to all success". With such good measures, students can update themselves with recent guidelines and policies, conduct self-test to check their status for quick medical response to help the infected recover in time and to protect their neighbours.

In addition, similar rapid response actions or measures are taken in the Student Halls of Residence where regular disinfection activities are carried out, provision of test kits to residents and strict adherence to the COVID-19 measures (i.e., wearing of mask, social distancing, and self-reporting of any symptoms of covid for assistance). Subsequently, the counselling service at PolyU and the Halls of Residence have been instrumental in providing effective emotional counselling support for students in the period of self-quarantined. All these measures, in addition to vaccination of staff and students have influenced the decline in cases both on campus and the student halls. This has resulted in a gradual resumption to normal operations on campus from April 1, 2022.

I therefore encourage all students to continue to observe all COVID-19 protocols and update themselves with regular communications from CRRTF via school emails. This would help us together in fighting the virus with the needed energy and action. Indeed, "we will overcome this and survive."


Summary

春節本是一個家人團聚, 朋友 之間相互走訪相約的難得節日。 但是這兩年因為疫情, 這些見 面都成了奢望,因此紅包更成 為傳遞新年祝福的重要媒介。 傳統意義上的紅包也叫壓歲錢, 是過農曆春節時長輩給小孩用 紅紙包裹的錢。因為紅色通常 代表著喜慶, 所以一般使用紅 色的紙,也因此稱之為紅包。 據傳在明清時期, 壓歲錢大多 數是用紅繩串著然後給孩子們。 從民國以後, 才開始演變為用 紅紙包裹。泛指包著錢的紅紙 包,用於喜慶時饋贈的禮金。

在中國粵語區,紅包被稱為利 市,俗稱利是、利事、勵事, 是將金錢放置紅色封套內做成 的一種禮品。在春節期間,除 夕晚上0點以後由長輩派給晚輩。 壓歲錢又名壓崇錢, 是不吉利的東西。古人借這個 習俗來表達來年不要有任何不 吉利的事情發生。也因此認為 紅包可以為收到它的人帶來幸 運。




圖1:線上Zoom平臺


Summary



城市信息学专题网络研讨会

The Webinar about the Urban Informatics was hold on 7th March from 9:00 pm to 11:00 pm.

In this year, this webinar was co-organized by the International Society for Urban Informatics (ISUI); the International Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing (ISPRS); and the PolyU Academy for Interdisciplinary Research (PAIR), the Otto Poon Charitable Foundation Smart Cities Research Institute (SCRI), and the Department of Land Surveying and Geo-Informatics (LSGI).

The webinar was initiated and hosted by Professor Wenzhong Shi, Academician of International Eurasian Academy of Sciences, Fellow of Academy of Social Sciences (UK), and Director of Otto Poon Charitable

Foundation Smart Cities Research Institute of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. This webinar includes two parts: the inviter speeches and a roundtable discussion session.
