Travel Documents, Student Visa & No Objection Letter (for non-local student legal employment)

- Please make sure that you have already received your Student Visa, and valid travel documents (e.g. passport or the Exit-entry Permit for Travelling to and from Hong Kong and Macao [往來港澳通行證]).
- Eligible non-local students will be notified individually by Immigration Department with a “**No Objection Letter**” (NOL) upon approval of entry applications for legal employment during their studies in HK.

Important points to note when traveling to HK

- Schedule your transportation arrangements once you have obtained your student visa.
- **Purchase travel insurance** for your trip to Hong Kong on your own, if applicable.



While you will be covered by the basic insurance coverage (Group Personal Accident Insurance) for joining PolyU activities during your stay in Hong Kong, please arrange Group Medical (GM) Insurance on your own, if needed. You may reference to **Register of Licensed Insurance Intermediaries** when sourcing.

Accommodations at halls



Earliest Check-in Date: 5 August 2024 (Monday)

- The Hall Administration of Student Halls will send you the hall application result with the check-in procedures in due course.
- Students should make their own accommodation arrangements for the period before the scheduled check-in date.
- The check-in counter operates from 9.30 am to 9.30 pm. To better manage the check-in arrangement, students are encouraged to arrive before 9.00 pm.
- Late check-in after 11.00 pm will generally not be considered. For students who need to check-in after 11.00 pm, please email the Hall Administration and attach a copy of their inbound travel tickets at least 3 working days prior to their arrival in Hong Kong for consideration.

Packing checklist



- Your own beddings (e.g. pillow covers and quilt) for hall residences
- Cold resistant clothes
- Shower proof jacket
- You can expect sunny and comfortable temperatures in November and December; occasional cold fronts with temperatures may drop below 10 °C in urban areas in January and February; occasional mist and showers in March and April.
- Tropical cyclones of different intensities may strike Hong Kong in May to November.
- There is no heating system in Hong Kong while air-conditioning is common within PolyU campus and most buildings around Hong Kong.



- The standard electrical voltage is 220 volts and 13A 3-pin flat top plugs are used in Hong Kong.
- Only qualified convertor plugs are allowed in the Halls.

- First-aid and medicine you need to take regularly
- Your own laptop (Free Wi-Fi services are available in halls and campus areas for PolyU students)
- One set of clothing or dress that is particular to your cultural or ethnic heritage (for certain events at PolyU that celebrates specific cultures)

5 Programme registration

- You should have received an e-mail/SMS on the offer. You can then have access to your application and check the online “Notice of Offer”.
- Please refer to the Registration Procedures stated on your online “Notice of Offer” for programme registration and you will get your Student Number afterwards.



Complete Programme Registration as soon as possible according to the schedule.

6 PolyU Student NetID registration

- After completing the programme registration, use your Student Number to **register your PolyU Student NetID**.
- Your Student NetID allows you to access PolyU online facilities and services including University Portal, student email account, etc.
- Please complete the mandatory **"Online Training Module on Preventing Sexual Harassment on Campus"** using your Student NetID before checking-in student halls or before getting Student ID Card if you are not residing in student halls.

By Mass Transit Railway (MTR)
(around 50 minutes for whole journey)

- Take "Airport Express" from Airport Station to Tsing Yi Station and interchange to "Tung Chung Line" (towards Hong Kong) at platform 4 to Nam Cheong Station
- At Nam Cheong Station, head to platform 2 and take the "Tuen Ma Line" (towards Wu Kai Sha) to Hung Hom Station
- Get off from Hung Hom Station and walk to Hung Hom Halls

(around 85 minutes for whole journey)

- Take Cityflyer route A21 at Airport (Ground Transportation Centre) and get off at Hung Hom Station bus stop
- Walk to Hung Hom Halls



By taxi (around 40 minutes)

- Take urban taxis (red) and drop off at Hung Hom Halls





From Hong Kong West Kowloon Station
(High Speed Rail)


(around 20 minutes for whole journey)

- Walk from Hong Kong West Kowloon Station to Austin Station
- Take MTR "Tuen Ma Line" (towards Wu Kai Sha) from Austin Station to Hung Hom Station
- Walk to Hung Hom Halls



From the nearest MTR station

- Get off from Whampoa Station (Exit B) and head to Dock Street, walk through Po Loi Street to Student Halls (around 8 minutes)
- Get off from Hung Hom Station (Exit B1) and walk through the footbridge via Royal Peninsula to Hung Hom Halls (around 8 minutes)

Getting an Octopus card

- Octopus is a contactless payment tool which is easy to use, you can use it for public transport, shopping and more.
- You can get an Octopus at MTR Customer Service Centres.



Full-time students under the age of 25 can apply for a Personalised Octopus with "Student Status" to enjoy **concessionary fares** for most public transportation. The **Application form** will be available on the MTR website in early September.

6 Purchasing pre-paid SIM card

- You can visit the stores of mobile network operators to purchase a SIM card for your mobile phone or subscribe to a monthly mobile service plan once you are settled.
- If you purchase SIM card issued by telecommunications service providers in Hong Kong, you have to complete real-name registration with your own **original identity document** so as to activate the card.
- The registration is easy and fast, you can refer to the **general registration steps** section and the **weblinks** by telecommunications service providers.

- According to the Registration of Persons Ordinance, persons aged 11 or over and has been permitted to stay in Hong Kong for more than 180 days must register for a Hong Kong Identity Card (HKID card) within 30 days of arrival.

- You are advised to make an appointment 96 working days in advance through the **Online Appointment Booking System** before visiting **Registration of Persons Offices** for services. Please bring along the **documents** to support your application.

- Once you get the HKID card, you are entitled to use the government medical services at local rates. You are required to carry your HKID card **at all times**.

8 Opening bank account

- You may receive fees refund, scholarship and other payments from the University from time to time. You need to have a local bank account number because all such payments will be arranged through the bank's auto-pay service.
- Opening local Hong Kong Dollar bank accounts is free. Please check the **documents** needed.
