






SHTM Outbound Exchange Process (Semester 2)

Before Exchange


- Take care of application for exchange required by the host university
- Submit your application form, the relevant supporting documents required by the host institution, <u>SHTM's Learning Agreement</u>, <u>Exchange Study Plan</u>, and <u>PolyU's Form AR41a</u> to <u>Miss Linda Law</u> (email: <u>linda.law@polyu.edu.hk</u>) before the specified deadline
- Apply for the necessary visa, book the air tickets, arrange for insurance, and pack
- Attend the briefing session organized by GEO
