We successfully organised a total of 10 activities with an estimated involvement of more than 1,000 alumni and their families, students and targeted participants. The highlights of all the events are mentioned in the following sections.

4.1 SHTMAA Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2014

Venue: School of Hotel and Tourism Management

The Hong Kong Polytechnic University

Date: 16 January 2014

Number of Participants: Over 20

The Annual General Meeting 2014 of SHTMAA was successfully held. At the meeting, apart from adopting the financial report and reviewing events of the past year, members were also informed that membership had grown by 18.73% to 2,491 as at 31 December 2013. The business plan for 2014 was also reported.

It was approved during the meeting that Ms Alison Yau as Vice Chairman and Mr Philip Kwok as Secretary joined the Executive Committee of SHTMAA. Responding to the enquiry raised by a member about organizing activities for mainland Chinese members, a one-day tour in Pearl River Delta will be included in the business plan for 2015.



4.2 Happy Hour Gathering

Venue: The Green, Hotel ICON

Date: 16 January 2014

Number of Participants: 37

SHTMAA organized the New Year Happy Hour gathering with the aim of offering SHTM graduates a chance to come together and share experiences, while reliving their memorable SHTM years. 37 alumni members and their friends attended the cocktail party at The Green, Hotel ICON, on 16 January 2014. Delicious canapés and drinks were served while members caught up with one another and made new friends.







4.3 Community Day

Venue: Hotel Panorama by Rhombus

Date: 28 February 2014

Number of Participants: 25

SHTMAA organized a meaningful and educational hotel visit for a group of Secondary 5 ethnic minority students. Initiated and planned by Stephen Tai, the 2013 SHTMAA scholarship winner, the tour joined hands with CHEER catering to great interest from the ethnic minority students.

On 28 February, 25 ethnic minority students and teachers were invited to visit The Hotel Panorama by Rhombus, in TST, Kowloon. The group had the rare chance to learn more about the hotel industry and the career opportunities.

Ms. Alison Yau, Regional Director of Sales & Marketing, Rhombus International Hotels Group gave an introduction to the hotel. A hotel inspection followed to allow participants to tour around different operating departments of the hotel. The visit further strengthened the message to the students that hotel industry is a dynamic workplace where it embraces staff from different cultures and offers a promising future.

Date: 27 May 2014


Number of Participants: 18

On 27 May, SHTMAA organised a visit to the 1,700 acre Lee Kum Kee sauce manufacturing plant in Xinhui, Guangdong. 18 members joined the tour and had a fruitful one-day trip.

The tour offered a valuable opportunity for members to gain a better understanding about the operation of food production processes from raw materials to finished products. In addition, the members were inspired by the success story of a century-old family enterprise and impressed by the well established factory lines.







4.7 Alumni Tour – Summer Escape in Okinawa

Venue: Okinawa, Japan Date: 10 – 13 July 2014

During 10 - 13 July, a group of fourteen alumni and friends joined the Alumni tour for a special summer retreat in Okinawa, the southernmost coastline prefecture of Japan.



During the four day tour, which was expertly organised by Hong Thai Travel, members stayed in the Kafuu Resort Fuchaku Condo Hotel, a beachfront resort with totally relaxing accommodations. The group had very much enjoyed the traditional Japanese dining at some of the famous local restaurants, which included a full array of tempting native

cuisines that are distinct from the rest of Japan, such as the highly acclaimed Agu pork cuisine which is only available during festivity days.

Apart from the nice dining surprises, another highlight of the tour was visiting the dolphins. At the training centre, everyone got a chance to touch and interact with the dolphins, a highly intelligent and friendly creature. Another memorable experience was the visits to the local factories, in particular a venture to a famous sea salt factory in the scenic area. After that, they all stayed quite a long time in the souvenir shop sampling different types of cooking salt and

buying a lot of gifts.

Date: 29 November 2014


Number of Participants: 16



This tour presented a valuable opportunity for us to learn and appreciate what a natural and green international metropolis Hong Kong is.










5. MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

5. 1 Membership Update

A summary of the number of memberships since the commencement of the SHTMAA is depicted as follows. By end-2014, the membership numbers reached a new high of 3,211 with a 12.11% year-on-year increase.

The Executive Committee noted the increase in membership in both Hong Kong and the Mainland. Out of 347 new members who joined in 2014, 101 new applications were from Mainland China. The mainland members represent 15.35% out of the total memberships.



Besides the increase in membership numbers of SHTM graduates, the number of Associate Member also increased to 52 in 2014.
