Over 170 participants from different WHO CCs in the Western Pacific Region attended the The forum offered forum. a valuable opportunity for collective deliberation to achieve more effective and accountable partnerships. It also served as a platform for WHO CCs of different subjects to explore new ways of working together and strengthening the strategic nature of the partnerships between WHO and its collaborating centres.



By implementing the WHO's mandate, the Centre has played a proactive role in strengthening evidence-based community health services and improving the health outcomes of local, regional and global populations since the designation in 2007. In December 2011, the School of Nursing of PolyU was re-designated as a WHO Collaborating Centre for Community Health Services with the following terms of reference:

- To provide educational opportunities and programmes, as well as professional consultation for nurses to strengthen evidence-based service provision in community care;
- To develop and sustain an electronic data base to serve as a resources for training, research and collaboration in community health services development;
- To develop and test models of care in community health service provision, through collaboration with national and regional colleagues, research and evidence-based practice;
- To support the WHO and its member states' policies and programmes in matters relating to health service provision.

The 2nd Biennial Regional School Health Congress

WHO CC co-organized with the Association of Macau Nurses for holding the 2nd Biennial Regional School Health Congress 2014, which was held on 24 to 26 October 2014 in Macau.

Themed "A Continuum of Child Care from Hospital to the Community", the congress aims to raise the awareness of the public and the policy makers on the health care needs of children and adolescents, and to provide suggestions for enhancing child and adolescent health. Over 200 local and international scholars, health care professionals, academics, students, and school teachers joined the congress.

Member provides advisory role in AIDS and STI meeting

The School was invited by the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Programme on HIV and AIDS (UNAIDS) to participate in the National HIV/AIDS and STI Programme



Managers' Meeting for Selected Asian and Pacific Island Countries from 1 to 2 July 2015 in Manila, the Philippines. Mr Edmond Tong attended the meeting as a temporary advisor to review the national and regional progress towards HIV and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) goals and to consult on the WHO's and UNAIDS' draft global HIV and STI strategies for 2016-2021.

Mr Tong was also invited to serve as the rapporteur to deliver the conclusion and key recommendations. The recommendations such as intensifying HIV testing and retesting among key populations and the exploration of pre-exposure prophylaxis were highlighted. The report will be prepared and circulated among Western Pacific countries upon completion.

Summer Programme on HIV/AIDS: Public Health & Infection Control

Led by Mr Edmond Tong, and with the support of our colleagues Ms Kitty Chan, Ms Suki Ho, Mr Rick Kwan, Mr Timothy Lai, Ms Ivy Wong, Ms Annie Yip, and Ms Renee Leung, the School's WHO CC collaborated with the School of Nursing of Peking Union Medical College (PUMC) WHO Collaborating Centre for Nursing Policy-Making and Quality Management and Beijing Ditan Hospital (BDH) WHO Collaborating Centre for Comprehensive Management of HIV Treatment and Care to organise the summer programme on HIV/ AIDS: Public Health and Infection Control. This was a very rare opportunity that three collaborating centres joined together organising such a course for undergraduates to develop their competencies in HIV prevention and care. The programme was one of the initiatives of the WHO Network for HIV and Health in the Western Pacific Region.

Dr Lan Zhang, WHO Advisor, officiated the opening ceremony of the summer programme and she gave a speech on international and national policy on HIV infection. Around 100 nursing students (including 20 nursing students from PolyU) from Mainland China, Hong Kong and Taiwan joined the programme, which was held in Beijing from 4 to 12 August 2014. The programme aimed to enhance students' understanding on the concept of public health, epidemiology, infection prevention and control; strengthen students analytical skills to apply epidemiological data, identify risk factors and measures

for the management of communicable and noncommunicable diseases; and give an update on the latest HIV treatment and management. and the policy on HIV infection. The summer programme was proudly sponsored by the Ms Dorothy Wong and was the fourth programme running in Mainland China.
