SPEAKER'S BIOGRAPHY

Prof. Jed Montayre is Associate Head (Strategy) and Associate Professor in the School of Nursing at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. He also directs the JBI Hong Kong Centre of Evidence-based Healthcare Excellence, building capacity for evidence synthesis and real-world implementation with health-system, community, and industry partners. In addition, he serves as Editor of the Journal of Clinical Nursing and Deputy Editor-in-Chief of the Australasian Journal on Ageing. His work bridges research, education, and practice to advance evidence-based healthcare, longevity, and healthy ageing in Hong Kong and across the region.

Prof. Montayre has secured over HKD 30 million in research funding across Hong Kong, the Philippines, Australia, and New Zealand, collaborating with the World Health Organization, local government health bureaus, and community partners. He was also funded to write a book on healthy ageing in the Western Pacific, bringing personal stories to the forefront and underscoring his view that "ageing well" is deeply personal with no one-size-fits-all approach. He has chaired major conferences, including the Healthy Ageing Conference in Hong Kong, and continues to seek collaborative opportunities that connect research with practice and innovation. His contributions have earned international recognition, including the Outstanding Young Researcher Award and selection as a Top 10 Finalist in the Aster Guardians Global Nursing Award. His work has been featured by the South China Morning Post in the article "How to age well? Specialist in healthy ageing gives his tips on adding life to your years." He is currently partnering with The Karen Leung Foundation on a longitudinal study to raise awareness of healthy living and strengthen participation in cancer screening—an initiative that highlights opportunities for cross-sector collaboration to advance healthy longevity.
