# Our New Normal: Impact on Higher Education



- Expansion of the internet and on-line platforms like Zoom have allowed us to communicate virtually.
- On-line learning has expanded significantly, providing students with an opportunity to earn college credit without having to go to a classroom.
- New and growing sources of college credit, such as Advanced Placement (AP), IB, and PLA, will advance student progress around the world.




It is predicted that by 2025, 32% of students attending public four-year institutions will transfer with 30 or more credits from another institution.




#### Structure of U.S. Education System










#### **Credit Transfer Outcomes**

- US General Service Administration (GAO) analysis of student course taking over six years.
- Findings:
  - "Students lost an estimated 43 percent of college credit when they transferred, or an estimated 13 credits, on average"
  - Credit Loss by Pathway: Vertical transfers lost about 26 percent of their credit.



#### **IGETC**

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a series of courses that California community college students can complete to satisfy freshman/sophomore level general education requirements before transferring to most colleges and majors at UC campuses.

If you choose to follow IGETC, we recommend that you complete all the IGETC courses **before** you transfer. Otherwise you'll need to satisfy the specific freshman/sophomore level general education requirements of your UC college or school.

# Transfer Guarantee Programs



#### **ABOUT THE GUARANTEE**

The California Community Colleges and partnering institutions created this transfer program to make it easier for students like you to start at a community college, transfer to a guaranteed saved spot at a participating four-year university and earn a bachelor's degree.

#### **UW System Guaranteed Transfer Admission**

The UW System Guaranteed Transfer Admission Program provides "guaranteed" admission to students who start at any UW university or branch campus and directly transfer to another UW university. Students must fulfill certain credit, course, and grade point average requirements of the receiving institution in order to be eligible for the Guaranteed Transfer Admission Program.

You are guaranteed admission to the UW transfer university if you:

- 1. Begin college as a freshman at a UW System campus
- 2. Earn a minimum of 24 transferable degree credits
- 3. Earn a minimum 2.0 grade point average [3.0 for UW-Madison]




The official transfer and articulation system for California's public colleges and universities


# Takeaways
