Establishment of Hong Kong Qualifications Framework (HKQF) by Education Bureau in 2008

- Foster a lifelong learning culture
- Nuture a competent workforce for supporting the economic development in Hong Kong
- Provide learning and career progression pathways for youths, practitioners and learners



HKQF in Higher Education




- Overarching framework covering all sectors, including higher education
- Articulation of qualifications across all levels and sectors
- Underpinned by robust quality assurance mechanism



Articulation under HKQF



Encourage and facilitate the adoption of a transparent and fair credit accumulation and transfer (CAT) system



CAT Principles



Strengthen curriculum, credit and advanced standing interface and maximize student mobility

- Minimize duplication of learning
- Transparent, fair, flexible and userfriendly CAT system
- Based on learning outcomes
- Recognition of non-formal and informal learning (e.g. work integrated education; experiential learning)



CAT Principles



- Institutional autonomy
- Academic rigour and integrity of qualification
- Institutional commitment and cooperation (e.g. articulation agreements at program design and development stage)
- Rigorous quality assurance mechanism
